We will:

- Always care about our students' wellbeing and protect their safety at all times
- Make sure we always come to lessons well prepared and provide appropriately challenging work that paves the way for success in school and life
- Set appropriate homework regularly and use it to improve learning outcomes for students
- Offer opportunities to further enhance students' development into socially and culturally aware, well rounded members of the community through enrichment, assemblies, visits and wider exposure to the best that has been written and created
- Constantly strive to become better educators through our own reflective practices
- Provide rewards for students' endeavours and opportunities for pupils to become young leaders
- Work to meet the needs of all pupils in the school in a consistent way, making reasonable adjustments when we need to
- Ensure that each student's form tutor will follow each of their student's progress both academically and through their development of character
- Go out of our way to get to know each of our students as individuals and build relationships with them

Parent-school communication

- We believe that through regular communication, a relationship of trust between school and home can be created
- We will hold yearly parents' evenings and issue progress reports on a regular basis
- We will make sure that parents and carers are able to communicate with form tutors, teachers and other staff by phone or email, and will reply to all communication as soon as possible, usually within 48 hours
- We will communicate through Class Charts regarding achievements and behaviour concerns. If your child needs to remain in school for detention, we will communicate this through a Class Charts alert and email
- We will welcome parents and carers into the school community and will arrange relevant meetings as promptly as possible once a request has been made

Behaviour

- We will reinforce University of Birmingham School virtues and values consistently and fairly
- We will protect students from poor behaviour by insisting on high standards and holding students to account for their actions

Sixth Form Code of Conduct

As a University of Birmingham School Sixth Former we believe you have the potential to go to University. We believe that you don't have to go to University, but if you choose not to then it was a choice that you made. Also, going to University is not a 'right' - you have to earn your place at University through hard work.

To achieve this, we expect you to abide by the following Code of Conduct.

I will be serious about my education and serious about going to University.

- I will show determination and arrive at school on time every day.
- I will follow the Sixth Form Dress Code at all times.
- I will be organised and bring to school the correct equipment including the subject folders for the lessons that day and any materials I need for Study Periods.
- I will not use a mobile phone during lessons unless given specific permission by a teacher.
- I will check my school email daily and use it professionally and courteously.

I will work hard. I realise that to get to University I have to put in effort, it won't just happen.

- I will attend all timetabled lessons and arrive on time.
- I will be autonomous and complete homework and coursework for the deadlines that are set by teachers.
- I will go to the correct location at the start of each study period.
- I will use all my study periods productively for work. I will work quietly and show humility by allowing others to do the same.
- I will only use my phone for work during study periods and with headphones if needed.
- I will attend any Intervention or Supervised Study sessions when asked to by a member of staff.

I will be the type of person who wants to take part in things.

- I will take a full and active part in all Learning for Life and Enrichment sessions.

As a successful Sixth Former.....

- I will show good citizenship and treat the Sixth Form Centre and the wider school building with respect.
- I will show kindness and empathy, and treat everyone with dignity, respect and tolerance.
- I will speak to staff respectfully and politely, and follow instructions given to me.
- I will behave appropriately at all times, this includes time when I am off-site or travelling to and from school.
- I will correctly 'tap in' when I arrive and 'tap out' when I leave the school site.
- I will wear my school lanyard around my neck at all times.
- I will put my coat and outdoor wear away when I arrive in school and will not wear it, or carry it, around school.
- I will not have my headphones visible or my phone out as a move around school.

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The commitment to University of Birmingham School by parents/carers

I believe my child is capable of academic and personal success and that it is through hard work on the part of my child, with my support, that their potential will be realised

Learning

- I will make sure my child always come to lessons prepared with their equipment (including completed homework) and ready to engage with learning
- I will allow my child to participate in all school activities, including trips
- I will provide the school with all relevant documentation and information regarding their individual needs
- I understand that my child will have homework set on a daily basis, including weekends, and that homework volume and duration will increase as my child moves up through the school. It is my responsibility to see that homework is completed. I will regularly check Class Charts to support the completion of homework.

Healthy Living

- I understand that the school will encourage my child to have a healthy lifestyle, I will give my child healthy food and drinks to take to school and I support the choices made by the school in this respect
- I will encourage my child to take an active part in all sports and enrichment activities

Attendance

- I will ensure that my child arrives to school on time every day (8.50am), except in cases of illness or another legitimate reason
- If my child is absent, I will contact the school by 9am on the day of absence to report why my child is absent. If an absence lasts for more than one day, I will continue to keep the Attendance Officer informed.
- I will provide medical evidence for every absence where requested and understand that the school uses the Fast Track system to monitor and support good attendance of all of its students.

Parent-school communication

- I will always make myself available to the school by providing details (phone and email) for at least two emergency contacts which are regularly updated
- I will communicate with the school in a timely and polite manner, in line with the school's character virtues
- I will read all reports carefully, attend parents' meetings, regularly check Class Charts and check and sign any monitoring documents

Uniform and Equipment

- I will make sure my child wears the full Sixth Form dress code every day, or allow them to wear clean replacement uniform provided by the school. I understand that if they are not dressed according to the dress code they may be asked to return home to change
- I will make sure that my child has their correct equipment every day, including their subject folders for their lessons that day and any materials for study periods
- I understand that the school takes no responsibility for the damage, loss or theft of any personal electronic devices or items of value

Behaviour

- I understand the University of Birmingham School ethos and expectations of pupils and support its culture of Character Education
- I accept and support the Sixth Form Code of Conduct and the systems for holding students to account
- I understand that detentions may be given for not meeting the Sixth Form Code of Conduct and that it is my child's responsibility to attend
- I understand that my child cannot be excused from detention or any other after-school intervention. If my child cannot attend for a legitimate reason, I will contact the school to rearrange another date for them to complete their detention after-school.
