

Curriculum Overview KS5 (age 16-19)

In Years 12 and 13 students study three A levels – each of which has 10 periods per fortnight. Students may choose to study Further Mathematics as a fourth subject if their prior attainment at GCSE is suitable. The emphasis is on academic achievement at a high level, targeted towards university entry, and as such the offer is of a broad but focussed range of A levels, emphasising the core disciplines preferred by Russell Group universities.

The Learning for Life (L4L) Curriculum, which includes Character Education, Personal, Social, Health, Citizenship, and Economic Education (PSHCE), Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG), Relationships and Sex Education (RSE), and Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Education (SMSC), will be delivered through tutor time, in enrichment and via subjects; as such, these are not shown on the core plan below.
