

How can I support my child with their KS3 music lessons?

Support for parents and guardians on parents' evenings.



Music lessons require students to display high levels of self regulation and cooperative working. If your child struggles with managing their own behaviour, speak to your music teacher or pastoral team about techniques that might help them display the necessary behaviours for learning.

Students have between 38-57 hours of music each academic year, so their progress in this subject will likely be more modest than in Maths, English or MFL.



If your child loves music, or you would like them to be able to make more progress, they can take part in our musical enrichment programme. There are opportunities for instrumental or vocal lessons and to join a variety of music groups like choirs, bands or orchestras.

Students are also encouraged to participate in Birmingham Youth music activities, including the free musical ensembles run by the Birmingham Music Service
