# **Entry Requirements**



#### Minimum Entry Requirements

- At least five GCSEs at Grade 6 or above.
- Applicants must also achieve a minimum of GCSE Grade 5 in English Language and Mathematics.

#### **Subject Specific Entry Requirements**

- At least a Grade 6 at GCSE in the subject you want to study at A level.
- If the subject is not studied at GCSE, we may be able to accept associated subjects (these are available to view on our website).
- If a subject is oversubscribed, applicants may need to achieve at least a GCSE Grade 7. Typically, the following subjects are likely to be oversubscribed: Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Psychology.

#### **Discovering your passion**

We want students to leave University of Birmingham School Sixth Form with the skills, virtues (personal qualities) and experiences that will help you discover your passion, and give you the confidence and skill to pursue this. We also wish to prepare you with the experiences that employers and higher education institutions seek. We believe that active participation in all that the Sixth Form has to offer will allow each student to achieve this.

You will benefit from lectures, seminars and enrichment opportunities with a considerable number of external partners, including with our corporate partners and the University of Birmingham.

#### Supporting you to apply to University

Students are encouraged to visit a wide range of university and college open days. Speakers from the University of Birmingham give presentations, guest lectures, and seminars to the Sixth Form to help students prepare for transition to university study.

Students hear talks from the admissions team at the University of Birmingham, as well as take part in personal statement writing masterclasses. Students will also receive ongoing support from Sixth Form tutors and other staff to help create a compelling personal statement.

#### **Work Experience**

Work Experience at the Sixth Form is designed to gain valued employability skills, but also to inform future career decisions. We expect students to arrange work experience placements independently, to ensure that each placement is tailored to meet individual needs and interests, however our dedicated Sixth Form team are able to provide ongoing support and direction throughout the process.

### Character Education

Character education is part of everyday life at University of Birmingham School – it's what makes us distinctive. We believe that building character through the recognition, practice and development of virtues is just as important as doing well academically.

Through our Learning for Life (L4L) programme, weekly enrichment sessions and our teaching of subjects, we support students to practise and build on their strengths to develop intellectual curiosity, a forward-thinking approach and the practical wisdom to do the right thing for the right reason at the right time.

Our approach to character education has been developed in collaboration with the world-leading Jubilee Centre for Character and Virtues at the University of Birmingham. This is valued by both universities and employers, as students leave us with the ability to articulate the skills and virtues that make them a good fit for their chosen course or job.





Learning about character development throughout my time at UoBS has shaped the way I interact with others, how I handle challenges, and how I approach responsibility. ### **Enrichment**

#### Inspiring you to flourish

Enrichment is a core part of our timetabled week; it takes place every Friday afternoon for two hours and is compulsory for all students.

As humans, we learn and grow from new experiences. Enrichment is a vital part of our character education curriculum, where these additional learning opportunities enable students to put into practice virtues such as courage, curiosity, critical thinking and resilience.

We want all our students to be able to experience all the enrichment opportunities we have on offer so that they can have a breadth of experience and are not limited to activities within their comfort zone. As such, all students rotate between different activities on a weekly basis. Students will get the opportunity to: develop their communication skills through activities such as debating and current affairs; learn to cook for themselves using our state-of-the-art cooking room; get creative by having a go at embroidery or photography; and experience an exercise class such as spinning using world-class facilities at the University of Birmingham Sport and Fitness Centre.

There are also opportunities for students to opt in to an enrichment activity for a half term. For example, they can volunteer to support enrichment activities in the main school, choose to take part in Gold Duke of Edinburgh or apply to complete a mini research project within the Biology department focusing on future forests using our new green house.



I took part in a range of enrichment activities, including games club, baking sessions, and visits to a local care home where we spent time with elderly residents. Each experience offered something valuable, whether it was learning teamwork, developing compassion, or simply stepping outside my comfort zone.

We provide tailored support to our students aspiring to gain access to top universities and apprenticeships.




#### **University of Birmingham**

We are proud of our partnership with the University of Birmingham, allowing our students to access campus visits, guest lectures, work experience, and mentoring.



#### **Aspire Programme**

Aspire sessions prepare students looking to apply to competitive courses and universities. Our Aspire group meets weekly to focus on academic reading, critical thinking, and super-curricular research.



#### **UoBS Professionals**

Our Professionals programme is for students interested in routes to apprenticeships, and features guest speakers from top employers. It focuses on developing personal skills and preparation for applications, assessment centres, and interviews.



#### **The Brilliant Club Scholars Programme**

Scholars undertake a challenging university-style course with a PhD tutor to develop research and academic writing skills and produce a final assignment which is marked and moderated using university grades. On completion, Scholars attend a graduation event at one of their partner universities.



#### **The Access Project**

We partner with the Access Project to enable 15 students to take part in an intensive two-year mentoring programme focused on access to top UK universities.



#### **Extended Project Qualification**

All of our students can take the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) which involves completing a substantial, independent project on a topic of interest. The EPQ helps students to prepare for university study. It is equivalent to half an A level and is recognised by universities and employers.



#### **Up Learn**

All of our students studying Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics, Biology, and Psychology have free access to the Up Learn online learning platform to support their A level studies and revision.

"After UoBS, I did a Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery (MBChB) at the University of Leeds.
